2024 Budget

Nan Needs, Treasurer. Karen presented the proposed budget.

- Budget, current balance \$6,618.96. We are not yet able to see money in the Ohio State account. We should be able to access as soon as Missy (new Extension Office assistant) gets certified in that aspect of her job.
- Anticipated annual expense \$6,190, includes \$2,000 minimum balance that we agreed to last year.
- Only 2 income streams; 1) \$20 dues, of which half goes to state. 2) Plant sale, from which we usually make \$2,200.
- Intern training class costs as much as we get in fees.

Budget Discussion:

- Insurance now through Extension office, so it's no longer a cost.
- Laura asked about honorariums, an item that is not in the current budget proposal.
 We are still working on getting all people paid from last year. Speaker fees covered in PR or discretionary funds budget of Executive Committee.
- Question about awards budget. Some in Children's Garden need to be updated.
 Already in process.
- Accessible Hocking Valley checking account. Current balance is \$200. We'd like to increase that balance to \$500, because state can be slow and that would give us more flexibility to reimburse members. If dues are paid by check, (which is what Nan prefers), we can increase that figure by over \$300, easily. All plant sale money will go through checking account as well.
- Currently Nan does not have a way to access the state account. Missy (new Extension Office assistant) needs to get certified, which should happen in the next week or two.
- Who spends money? Nan has a list of who regularly speeds and needs access.
 Same six people: Debbi Daniels, Michael Lincoln, Terri Perez, Billie Kariher, Nan Needs, Cinda Morosko.
- Terri- reimbursement needs to be as efficient as possible. Discussion about various ways to get reimbursed.

Purchase Procedures Options:

- 1) Easiest way to do it is to get the credit card from Ed.
- 2) Remember to get the tax ID number.
- 3) If you are purchasing from Lowe's, at check out, type in Extension Office number (593-8555) and it will recognize our account.
- 4) If you need reimbursement, bring itemized receipt to Extension Office and Nan will write you a check. At White's Mill, make sure they itemize.
- Executive Group will meet to review and revise budget and present at next meeting.
 Members will then vote.
- Discussion about balance between expenses and income and how much money we should have in reserve.
- Nan would like dues in by mid-April.
