• **Children's Garden:** Terrie reports that a group of Cutler's Scholars (the group's focus for the year includes food) came to the garden in September to provide some extra work on garden maintenance. They also collected food to be donated to CFI

The garden produced a lot of golden cosmos seeds so Terrie collected the seeds and shared with MGV members at the meeting – thank you!
